NJ Presidential Poll: Kerry 46% Bush 43% Nader 5%

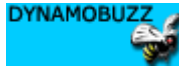

Joe Kyrillos Speaks on Property Taxes

I've generally been harsh with NJ GOP leader Senator Joe Kyrillos, who has been of the state party as it has been transformed from a governing majority to its current position as weak opposition party in the state. But I give the senator a lot of credit for putting forward a [plan](#) to address the issue of property taxes, spending and school funding. If more of our elected officials actually suggested solutions, then perhaps we wouldn't need some constitutional convention.

Kyrillos' plan would establish a different formula for state wide aid to schools that would not be as heavily based on the spending in the wealthier districts or incomes but on urban/suburban factors and the needs of the district. He would force the individual districts to give up their control over non-academic spending (transportation, food supplies) and turn that over to county purchasing boards. He would also limit year to year increases to the inflation rate with some adjustments for school population. Schools would lose up to 15% of their state aid for violating this provision. Teachers unions would be against that.

As Kyrillos says in the article "...you can't be for property tax reform and be for the status quo at the same time." Excellent job, Joe.
